The 4th Kaneko Awards 2021 Call for Nominations

The 4th Kaneko Awards 2021

1. Eligible Candidates

Candidates must be an individual who has contributed to our bilateral relations at the grass root level in areas including cultural exchanges, exchange of students, homestays, or other volunteer activities and those who contributed in education and other non-profit activities to promote understanding between two countries. It is not intended to award people who have served or are serving in high leadership positions and have already been recognized. Self-nominations will not be considered.

2. Prize

One Japanese and one American will each receive a plaque and a grant as a supplementary award. (The provision of round-trip tickets, which has been awarded as a supplementary prize, will be cancelled due to the COVID-19.)

3. Nominators

Members of the AJS, local societies in Japan and US, Americans living in Japan, and other Japan-America related organizations that have been requested by the AJS are eligible to nominate. Applications that were submitted for the third round of the 2019 selection process will be included in the 4th year's selection process, so there is no need to submit another application.

4. Nomination Process

- 1) Number of nominations: one by each nominator.
- 2) Fill in the nomination form completely and provide as much details as possible. Please attach supporting documentation to your nomination form.
- 3) Please submit the completed nomination form via email, FAX, or mail. Please note that submitted materials will not be returned.
- 4) Deadline: All nominations are due by March 31(Wed), 2021. → May 31 (Mon), 2021

5. Selection Process

After primary screening by selection committees will select the recipients. The results will be officially announced in Fall.
