Annual Report of FY 2020 2020 年度 年次報告

(2020年5月1日~2021年4月30日)

会長 藤崎一郎

2020 年度は、前年度から引き続き新型感染症(Covid-19)の影響、特に 3 回に渡る緊急事態宣言により、会員総会をはじめ定例会、イベントなどはリアル開催することができず、多くがオンラインでの開催となりました。特に、恒例の大使公邸でのレセプションやアウティングイベントなどは、開催そのものができず大変残念な年となりました。

そうした状況にも関わらず、2017年に立ち上げた百周年記念事業を含め、できる限りオンライン化することによって、イベントの開催数はリアルとオンラインを併せて31となりましたが、2019年度の40には達しませんでした。今後、ワクチン接種の拡大により新型感染症の影響は低減すると見込まれますが、会員の皆様の健康と安全を考え、イベントのオンライン化は暫く継続し、状況を見ながら徐々にリアル化への復活を進める計画でおります。この機会に会員の皆様の当協会への日頃のご支援に感謝し、2020年度の活動実績を報告いたします。

1) プログラムの実施状況

2020 年度に開催したプログラムの詳細は Calendar of Event (P10-12) をご覧ください。

各界から著名なゲストスピーカーをお招きしていた月例会については、一昨年度までは White & Case 法律事務 所から会場をご提供頂いておりましたが、昨年は実施した月例会 9 件は全てオンラインでの開催となりました。 開催の時間帯を夜に変更したことや参加の容易性から出席数は 160 人を超えることもあり、会員サービスの新た な可能性を示唆することになりました。 なお、オンラインイベントに於いてもリアルでのイベントの際と同様に 大井理事には同時通訳サービスのご提供につきご支援頂いておりますこと、この場を借りて御礼申し上げます。 その一方で、会員の交流を広める企画として、総会後の懇親会、米大使館公邸でのパーティー、在日米国商工会議 所との共催の「飲む・ニケーション」、米軍基地見学会、競馬観戦などを一昨年まで鋭意実行してきましたが、感染症拡大防止対策からゴルフ大会(2020 年 11 月実施のアイゼンハワー杯)を除き、全てキャンセルの止むなきに至りました。 しかしながら、オンラインによる交流の維持拡大を目指し、特異なご経歴や専門性を御持ちする会員を囲んだ小規模親睦会"AJS Salon"を立上げ、既に3回実施致しております。

これに加えて、100周年記念行事は、新型感染症拡大の影響で金子堅太郎賞の選考、アメリカボウル大会の開催、 VSJプログラムによる米国人研究者の日本招聘は全て中止の止むなきに至りました。 唯一、日米の若人により時 事討論を行うNGRTのみ感染症の状況を見つつ一部は森ビル様のご支援によってリアルセッションが開催できま したが、多くはオンラインでの実施となりました。

2) 会員の状況

P-13 にお示しした通り、新型感染症の影響で法人会員 6 社の退会乃至は休会、1 社の種別変更により、7 ユニット分が減少致しました。 個人会員については、維持会員及び正会員は入会/退会の出入りが激しかったものの結果的に横這いとなりました。 一方、準会員、学生会員は大幅に増加しております。この要因としては、NGRT 参加希望者に対し入会時にはプログラム参加費を免除したこと、学生会員の年会費を 3 千円から 2 千円に値下げしたことが奏功したものと考えております。

アメリカ人個人会員の構成比は依然 11%に留まり引き続き会員の皆様には個人会員の入会を、特にアメリカ人会員の入会を引続きご支援くださるようお願い申し上げます。

3) 役員について

当協会の役員(理事・監事)は定款第5章第18条により「理事9名以上13名以内(任期2年)、監事2名以内(任期4年)」と定められております。今年度は、理事13名中2名が今総会で任期を迎えますので、重任を今総会の議案として重任の承認をお諮り致します。ご承認頂きますと、今回重任を受けた2名を含めた再任理事は13名、監事は2名となります。尚、今年度に退任する理事・監事はおりません。

名誉会長は、昨年 11 月の臨時会員総会により安倍晋三前総理が就任されましたが、米国側の名誉会長は 2019 年 8 月のハガティ大使離任ののち空席となっていますが、新大使の正式着任次第、就任を要請する予定です。 また 名誉副会長には今年初めまで駐米大使をされた杉山晋輔大使にご就任頂きます。 尚、長らく協会顧問を努められ た槙原稔顧問、谷静子評議員が 2020 年 12 月にご逝去されました。協会活動に対する長年に渡るご貢献に改めて深く感謝すると共に衷心よりご冥福をお祈りいたします。 その他に移動はございません。 P8-9 をご覧ください。

4) 財務・経理の状況

収支の状況は、①通常の一般事業と②100周年記念事業に分けて報告します。

- ① 一般事業の状況: P-14 に記述の通り、昨年度の赤字(△281 千円)から黒字(524 千円)となりました。収入面では法人会員 6 社の退会・休会に加えて会費制プログラムの非実現が大きなマイナス要因となりましたが、新型感染症に係る持続化給付金の助成を受けたことによって一時的に黒字となっております。2022 年度は同給付金は見込めず赤字化が不可避となるため、会員数の維持・拡大、事務所経費の削減、イベントでのコスト超過回避を柱に採算維持と会員サービスの向上を目指します。
- ② 100周年記念事業の状況: P-15 に記載の通り、会員の皆様より頂戴した「100周年記念基金」を大切に使い4つの記念事業を鋭意推進の結果、2020年度末時点で1,640千円を費消し期末での残額は82,962千円となっております。

5) 100周年事業について

頂戴したご寄附は特に日米相互理解と友好促進を進めるため、さらには日米の若人の国際交流を支援するための以下の 4 つのプログラムに使用してまいりました。2020 年度の実績と決算は P-15、2021 年度の予算は P-20 をご参照ください。

① 日米協会金子堅太郎賞

同賞は日米交流に草の根レベルで貢献した一般人を対象とする賞です。選考委員会は委員長を斉藤邦彦元駐米大使(当協会名誉副会長)に、委員には茂木キッコーマン名誉会長、大橋 ANA ホールディングス相談役、ラフルアー在日米国商工会議所会長(当協会副会長)、ジャーナリストの国谷裕子氏、久保文明防衛大学校校長、日米協会を代表して小職を委員としています。2020年度は、表彰対象者の選考対象を厚くするため当初から一時中断を計画致しましたが、2021年度も新型感染症の拡大に歯止めが掛かっておらず公募や推薦過程への影響が避けられないことから選考を中止し、2022年度に第4回金子賞の選考再開を予定しています。

2 NGRT (Next Generation Round-table in Tokyo)

次世代向けのプロジェクトの目玉として、「次世代ラウンドテーブル in TOKYO (NGRT)」を実施しています。東京でアメリカ人と英語で議論する場を作ろうという発想で、NGRT を通じ若手のアメリ

カ人と日本人のネットワーキングを図ることを狙いとしています。年間を通じ 10 回程度を六本木ヒルズクラズ (会場ご提供: 森ビル) にて行い、米人をはじめ企業会員の若手社員からも多数の参加を得ております。

昨年の10月から第4期生によるプログラムとして4月末まで6回実施していますが、10、11月分実施のリアル開催2回を除き全てオンラインでの実施としています。 毎回各界の新進気鋭のスピーカーをお招きすることで活発な議論が展開され参加者にも好評です。2020年10月から募集の第4期生より40歳未満の会員への参加を無料とすることで若手の会員増に直結する制度と致しました。

③ Visit and Study Japan Grant Program (VSJ)

米国の大学院で日本研究を行っている米国人学生の短期日本研究訪問の助成金プログラムです。 別途選抜された米国の大学院生に助成金を提供し、実際に来日する際の費用を援助します。2020 年度 は日本研究を行っている米国 40 大学を選定し募集を実施したものの、新型感染症に直接的な影響を受 け、応募者 1 名を得るに留まりました。当該者を合格としましたが来日研究の目途が立たなかったた めプログラム自体を中止しました。2021 年度は、来日滞在費用を外務省所管 KAKEHASHI プロジェ クトで助成頂くこと、及び新型感染症の影響により当該年度中の来日が不可である場合には2022 年度 に延期可能とする条件を整備し、米国 40 大学 260 研究室に公募を致しております。(後援:外務省)

④ アメリカボウル大会

アメリカボウル大会は、日本人高校生を対象に、アメリカの歴史・文化・芸術・地理・科学・日米関係などについての知識を簡単な英語で問うクイズ大会です。米国のワシントン DC 日米協会が永年開催しているジャパン・ボウルの経験を活かしてアメリカ人と日本人合わせて15名程度の準備委員会を構成し、準備を進めましたが、2020年度に実施予定の第3回大会は新型感染症の発生により新学期の開始が著しく遅れた状況等に鑑み中止と致しました。2021年度は、新型感染症の影響を極小化するため、オンラインでの予選大会と小規模・少人数での決勝戦の組合せとすることにより、開催準備を進めております。

Annual Report FY2020

For the fiscal year ended April 30, 2021

Dear Members of the Society,

Most of the events in 2020, including the general meetings and monthly programs, have been switched to online since the start of the fiscal year due to Covind-19, especially following the restrictions by the state of emergency. In particular, it was our regret that the reception at U.S. Ambassador's Residence and the other outing events which all of us looked forward to attending were not realized. Notwithstanding the number of the events including the centennial program since 2017 has reached 31 by switching to online as best as possible, which did not reach 40 in 2019. While the influence by Covid-19 would be mitigated by the gradual rollout of vaccination, we believe the health and safety of our members should remain prioritized and thus the online events would be sustained for a time being with a view to resume the real events cautiously depending on the situation. We would like to thank all members and ask for their continued support and cooperation.

The following are the summary of our activities in FY 2020.

Firstly, regarding the regular programs as shown in p10-12, monthly meetings had been held in the office of White & Case LLC with the guest speakers of prominent figures from various fields over the preceding years till 2019. However, in 2020, all of the nine events were forced to be held online. Having said that, the number of attendants sometimes exceeds 160 with the easiness of participation by the time-slot changes. This epitomizes the new style of service to the members. We really appreciate the consistent support of simultaneous interpretation arranged by Dr. Takashi Oi even for the online programs.

In the meantime, the large-scale events, for example, an ordinary general assembly, the garden party at the US ambassador's residence, the co-hosted event with ACCJ, along with other outing events such as a visit to the US military bases and a horse race event were cancelled with an exception of holding the Eisenhauer-cup golf competition in November. Nevertheless, we have started a small-scale program called "AJS Salon" focusing on some members with unique expertise, which aims to reinforce the friendship within the members. We have already held it three times so far.

In addition, almost all the programs relating to the centennial event, e.g., Kentaro Kaneko Award, America Bowl and VSJ program, were cancelled with an exception of NGRT, a few sessions of which were held in person with the support by Mori Building co., Ltd. while all the other sessions were held online.

Secondly, regarding the number of AJS members, we had to see off 6 corporate members and accept one down grading for some corporate member owing to the influence of Covid-19. As for the individual members, the number of Regular and Sustaining members remain almost unchanged after all. The number of Associate and Student members has largely increased because of the admission policy change of NGRT, which exempts the admission for AJS members. And we also started to reduce the membership fee for Student members from JPY3,000 to JPY2,000. As the percentage of individual American members still remains at 11%, once again we would like to ask our members to continue to support the admission of individual members, especially American members.

Thirdly, with regard to the officers of the Society, in accordance with Chapter 5, Article 18 of the articles of association, the number of officers should be at least 9 and up to 13 directors for a term of two years. In addition to the above, there is a maximum of 2 auditors for a term of four years. This year, 2 members of the Board of Directors will be termed out and hence need reappointments at the general meeting. If they are approved, the total number of directors is 13, including the said reappointed directors, there are 2 auditors, and no retiring directors and auditors. At the last extraordinary meeting in November, 2020, the former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe was inaugurated as Honorary President. As for the other position of Honorary President which has been vacant since Ambassador William F. Hagerty left his post in 2019, we will ask the newly accredited ambassador to resume the position as soon as he is formally appointed. In addition, we will welcome Ambassador Shinsuke J. Sugiyama, former Ambassador to the US, as our Honorary Vice-President.

In the meanwhile, we have to extend our heartfelt condolences to Mr. Minoru Makihara, the member of Advisors, and Ms. Shizuko Tani, the member of Councils, both of whom made a great contribution to our society for long years but sadly passed away in December, 2020. Other Honorary Vice Presidents, members of Advisors and Councils will continue to serve as the same as before.

The fourth theme is about finance and accounting, the details of revenue and expenditure are reported in two categories: regular general operations and centennial commemorative operations.

1) General operations: As described on P-14, the last year's deficit (-280,000 yen) was replaced by a surplus (524,000 yen). In terms of revenue, although we've seen six corporate members leave the society with almost no event revenues at hand, we have barely reached that surplus which is solely owing to the extraordinary Covid-19 related grant by the government, which is utterly temporary. As we cannot expect the grant by the government anymore and hence will inevitably face the risk of deficit, we will strongly seek for acquiring the new members, reducing the cost and avoiding any cost overrun for the real events with

the quality of service appropriately sustained.

2) Status of 100th Anniversary Projects: As described on P-15, we deliberately and effectively consumed the "100th Anniversary Fund" given by our members, resulting in a balance of ¥82,962,754 at the end of the fiscal year with ¥1,639,570 being used up. Last but not least, I am pleased to touch upon the situations of four centennial programs as follows. Our members' contribution to the centennial fund helped to promote mutual understanding and friendship between the U.S. and Japan, as well as the international exchange of the young generation. We have used the fund for the following four programs:

1. The Kaneko Award (4th year)

The award is given to Americans and Japanese who have made grassroots contributions to U.S.-Japan relations. The selection committee is chaired by Mr. Kunihiko Saito, former Ambassador to the United States and Honorary Vice President of the Society, joined with Mr. Yuzaburo Mogi, Kikkoman Corporation / Honorary CEO and Chairman of the Board of Directors, Mr. Christopher J. LaFleur, our Vice President and Chairman of the American Chamber of Commerce in Japan, Ms. Hiroko Kuniya, a journalist, and Professor Fumiaki Kubo of National Defense Academy and myself. Although we have decided to suspend the selection in order to expand the pool of candidates, we will continue the suspension until 2022 considering the present Covid-19 situation having an impact on the selection process.

2. Next Generation's Roundtable in Tokyo (NGRT)

As the centerpiece of the projects for the young generation, the Next Generation's Roundtable in Tokyo (NGRT) is a series of opportunities to discuss with Americans in English. Through the NGRT meetings, young Americans and Japanese members enjoy networking. We started the fourth intake last October and have held six sessions till the end of April with two sessions in person and the others held online. The program has become popular among the participants having the up-and-coming speakers invited. From the fourth intake, we have exempted the admission fee for the AJS member, which directly increase the number of Associate and Student members.

3. Visit and Study Japan Grant Program (VSJ)

This is a grant program for U.S. students studying Japanese studies at the U.S. graduate schools to visit Japan for a short period of time. Although we have invited the applications from 260 rooms in 40 U.S. universities conducting the research on Japan, only an American student applied, who eventually gave up coming to Japan because of the passage forbidden. For the upcoming 2021, we have already notified the application to the same universities in the US, jointly supported by KAKEHASHI Project of MOFA

with special conditions on Covid-19 which can extend the visit to Japan till next year.

4. America Bowl Tournament (3rd year)

The America Bowl is an opportunity for Japanese high school students to learn about American history, culture, art, geography, science, and the relationship with Japan. This is a quiz competition that asks questions in simple English. The Japan-America Society of Washington, D.C., has been hosting the Japan Bowl for many years. Although we had started the preparation, we decided to suspend the program as the start of the term was delayed because of Covid-19. For 2021, we have already started the preparation planning to hold an online preparatory session, followed by the small-scale semi-final/final sessions in the autumn.

We will endeavor to meet the request of our members enough to strengthen the AJS. We look forward to your continued understanding and support.
